A regulatory agency is any agency ... that has any of the following responsibilities for the whole or part of a regulatory system: monitoring; evaluation; performance reporting; policy advice; policy and operational design; legislative design; implementation; administration; information provision; standard-setting; licensing and approvals; or compliance and enforcement.

Public trust and confidence, and the effective use of charitable resources


Functions
